

Cabin 6: Larry and Georgia Davis

Seen any good art lately? Step through the door of this quaint cabin, and get an eyeful! Larry and Georgia's interest in the early local artists' colony was kindled by the gift of the book *The Artists of Brown County*, by Lynn Letsinger-Miller. The Davises purchased and set about restoring the property in 2003. The former



home of Adolph and Ada Shultz, the cabin was moved to this location from the Brown County State Park around 1924. Keeping the original footprint of the house, renovation included building a new foundation and knocking down some walls. Now the house glows from the soft peach paint used throughout the main level and natural light from lots of new windows. In the cabin room, you'll find a portrait of Adolph, and a clutch of paintbrushes formerly belonging to artist Marie Goth. Grasp the original, rustic sassafras handrail as you climb the stairs to the attic bedroom. The numbers on the logs as you go up are the means by which the house was reconstructed in the proper order 80 years ago. The couple's wonderful collection of paintings and pottery from Brown County's early artists will surely captivate the art lovers who visit this weekend.
